GENERAL PURPOSE

Performs a variety of skilled and unskilled tasks in the custodial care and maintenance of Riverfront Community Center.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED

Works under the close supervision of the Custodial Supervisor.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED

None generally. May supervise other temporary employees or community service workers.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

(Duties listed below do not include all tasks which may be performed).

- Changes light bulbs and florescent tubes.
- Sweeps, vacuums, mops, dusts, shampoos, steam cleans, strips, waxes, polishes, and buffs floors, carpets, and furniture, etc.
- Dumps ash cans and garbage and relines cans with liners.
- Cleans and sanitizes restrooms and replenishes supplies; cleans spills; cleans drinking fountains, kitchens, meeting rooms, recreational areas, mirrors, tables, walls, fixtures, blinds, light fixtures, etc.
- Washes windows, walls, metal and woodwork.
- Cleans rain gutters; sweeps roofs and sidewalks.
- Picks up litter from around buildings and grounds.
- Performs minor semi-skilled interior building maintenance and repairs.
- Inspects and maintains assigned custodial equipment and small tools for proper operating condition.
- Opens and closes, locks and unlocks facilities as needed. Performs building security checks.
- Keeps records of work completed.
- Maintains current skills and knowledge in the proper and safe techniques of building maintenance.
- Moves and sets up furniture, pictures, etc. as needed and assigned.
- May perform other duties as assigned.

PERIPHERAL DUTIES

- Interior painting and dry wall repair.
- Sets up and takes down athletic equipment, i.e., volleyball nets, scoreboards, etc.
- May be cross-trained to fill other positions on an as-needed basis.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Required Education and Experience:

- (A) High school diploma or equivalent.
- (B) Any combination of experience and training which demonstrates the knowledge and experience to perform the work.
- (C) Must be able to speak, read and write English.
- (D) Must be at least 18 years of age.

Necessary Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

(A) Working knowledge of equipment, materials and supplies used in building and grounds maintenance; working knowledge of equipment and supplies used to do minor repairs and painting; some knowledge of first aid and applicable safety precautions.

- (B) Skill in operation of listed tools and equipment.
- (C) Ability to work independently and to complete daily activities according to work schedule; ability to lift heavy objects, walk and stand for long periods of time; ability to communicate orally and in writing; ability to use equipment and tools properly and safely; ability to understand and follow written and oral instructions; ability to establish effective working relationships.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

First Aid and Red Cross Multi Media CPR, or obtain within 120 days of hire date.

TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT USED

Floor buffers, steam cleaners, carpet cleaners, washers, vacuum, mops, brooms, dusting equipment, power lift, and hand and power tools.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is required to reach with hands and arms. The employee frequently is required to stand; walk; and use hands to finger, handle, feel or operate objects, tools or controls. The employee is frequently required to sit; climb or balance; stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl; and talk or hear.

The employee must occasionally lift and/or move up to 50 pounds and seldom lift and/or move up to 70 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, and the ability to adjust focus.

WORK ENVIRONMENT

The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee occasionally works near moving mechanical parts. The employee occasionally works in high, precarious places and is occasionally exposed to wet and/or humid conditions, fumes or airborne particles, and toxic chemicals.

The noise level in the work environment is usually quiet.

SELECTION GUIDELINES
